Discuss:

- 1. What is difficult about loving your neighbors?
- 2. Think about this statement. "Any Christian ethic that does not produce loving relationships has failed." Why is loving our neighbor a necessary outcome of Christian ethics?
- 3. If you were to describe what God's love looks like to a friend, what would you say?
- 4. If you were love your neighbor like God has loved you, what would you be doing? (1 John 4:9)
- 5. Have we taught our church to serve the community, but failed to disciple them to love their neighbors? (Neighboring Church)
- 6. Have you ever had a Christ-like mentor of neighborly love?
- 7. If you were developing a course on neighboring, what would you want your students to learn?
- 8. Do you see your home more as a place to escape the world, or a place to engage the world?
- 9. What would be different about the world if Christians saw their homes not as a place of refuge from the world, but as places of refuge for the world?
- 10. Should there be a difference between how Christians and non-Christians neighbor?
 - Do you know your neighbors' names? (Reference your neighborhood maps.)
