7. How is Bible knowledge both a valuable and yet a dangerous thing to have? How can we grow in Bible knowledge and avoid the dangers of hypocrisy?
8. How do you know if a professing Christian is not a "real Christian?" (2:21-24)
9. What is needed for someone to truly be a Christian? (2:25-29)
10. What advantage was there in being a Jew? (3:1-2)
11. What were some reasons the Jew had for a false assurance of salvation? (3:3-8) What are some reasons a church attender could have false assurance of their salvation?
12. What are the implications of these passages on Christians desiring to share their faith?
